 - GA Student Health Survey comparison to Georgia. Rockdale's 30-day alcohol use dipped during the pandemic, then the survey was skipped in 2021, 2022 there was a dip with a rise in 2023. The community is still below the State average. However, 30-day RX (Tranquilizers) was higher than the State for the past few years.
 - \circ $\;$ Reminded the collation about the Community Goals $\;$
 - PreVenture- Spring 2023- 54 students were screened, 45 students were placed, and 38 students were served. Student feedback- "coming here has helped me not feel alone."
 - Prime For Life- 54 young adults referred and 18 completed. Exploring expansion of referral base to parents of young adults and other partners.
 - Social Availability and Community Awareness- YTD- 2,680 participants and 688,014 reached.
 - Safe Storage and Disposal- YTD- 1,175 (in-person) participants and 1,022,311 reached.
 - $\circ~$ 2As and an R- YTD- 440 (in-person) reached.
 - Community Readiness Scores are going up as the community is becoming more and more aware.
